(You may also include a point made during the final three-minute rebuttal the petitioner is allowed).

Respondent

(the party that won in the lower court)

What did you think was the best point the respondent made in the opening statement?

Note one question from a justice that you thought was especially helpful in getting the respondent to clarify a point.

Note one question or point from a justice to the respondent that surprised you or that you just thought was interesting.

What did you think was the best point the respondent made during the question and answer period?

How do you think the Supreme Court should rule in this case? Explain your reasoning in at least three sentences.
