

Tabroom Step-by-Step Guide

STEP ONE: Go to the [Volunteer Registration Page](#) and log in.

Returning Tabroom User (with a Tabroom account):

- In the middle of the page, click on “[log in](#)” and log in
- Go to Step Two



New to Tabroom (without a Tabroom account):

- In the middle of the page, click on “[sign up](#)”

Next Screen

- Fill out the information underneath the “[Otherwise, create a new account](#)” heading.
 - A phone number is required
 - Then click on “[Create account](#)”
 - You will receive an email from Tabroom.com with a verification code to the email provided to complete your Tabroom account.
- Once you have successfully logged in, go to Step Two.
